Position

The Learning Support Teacher (LST) works with the Student Support Team to support the learning community in removing barriers to learning for designated students with learning needs, to enhance students' participation and achievement. They gather evidence and data about students with possible additional needs, and collaborate with teachers, families, and other pedagogical leaders when relevant, to build a clear, consistent, and comprehensive support plan.

When appropriate, the LST leads professional development opportunities for staff members to further their understanding of inclusion and ability to identify learning diversities. They support inclusive classroom practice and encourage staff to develop understanding and empathy for students experiencing barriers to learning. The LST provides training, coaching, mentoring and joint planning sessions to increase access and engagement in learning. They may also make recommendations to modify facilities, reorganize learning spaces, or purchase materials and resources to better facilitate inclusive learning and teaching.

Areas of Responsibility

The Learning Support Teacher will:

- be accountable to the Head of School, and adhere to all school-wide policies
- be a contributing member of the BIS school community
- conduct observations of students and teachers to gather evidence and data regarding students with possible additional needs
- build a clear and comprehensive support plan with teachers and assistant teachers to remove barriers to learning and enhance participation across the school, including preparing and adapting resources and programme materials, to enhance participation across the school
- provide training, coaching, mentoring and joint planning sessions to increase access and engagement in learning

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- coordinate and facilitate Student Support Team weekly meetings, consistently detailing progress and next steps for further growth of each student
- create Individual Learning Plans for students when applicable, assisting teachers and parents with their implementation
- work flexibly with a student or group of students as agreed upon
- liaise with families in conjunction with the Area Principals and classroom teachers
- collaborate with the BIS Student Wellness Coordinator to support students, parents, and teachers
- build relationships with local agencies, collaborating with other learning support professionals to support individual student growth
